# Parking

We encourage you to take advantage of our designated pay parking lots on the west side of town (Exit 40 from Hwy 163) on Friday and Saturday, and on the southeast side of town (Exit 44 from Hwy. 163) on Saturday only. Cost is \$8 per vehicle and includes a free shuttle into the downtown area. View maps online at www.pellatuliptime.com/parking.

A limited amount of handicap parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis at the Pella Public Library parking lot with access from Liberty Street. Walking is part of the festival! Please be sure to wear comfortable shoes!

# Getting Around

Streets around the town square and in the parade staging area are closed to vehicle traffic during the festival.

Most events and activities at our Tulip Time Festival are within walking distance of a four-block radius of the town square. Golf cart shuttles are available for your convenience for \$2 per ride or \$5 per day. Day passes may be pre-ordered or purchased the day of the festival from a golf cart shuttle driver or at the ticket booth. Golf carts pick up and drop off passengers at designated sites only.

#### Shuttle hours: 10 am - 2 pm and 4 pm - 8 pm.

During the festival, a schedule of events and locator map will be available from the information centers.



Parade

One of the highlights of our Tulip Time Festival is the parades! We feature two parades on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, an afternoon parade at 2:30 pm and a lighted evening parade at 8:30 pm.

The best way to see the parade is from the Grandstand! A Grandstand ticket will not only provide you with a seat for the parade, but a perfect seat for viewing the Grandstand show, which begins 90 minutes prior to parade time. Park tickets are also available, providing some shaded seating and an excellent option for our guests in wheelchairs and walker seats.

The afternoon Grandstand show features Dutch dancing and singing, Parade of Provinces (Dutch costume style show), presentation of the Queen and her Court, the famous street scrubbing and more. Grandstand seats are free for the evening show and parade thanks to the generous support of Central College!

#### **Tulip Avenue in Central Park and** Sunken Gardens Park

The City of Pella plants tens of thousands of tulips throughout these two parks in celebration of Pella's Dutch heritage. Especially vibrant and colorful is the Tulip Avenue in Central Park which runs from the North fountain to the center of the park. An immense variety of tulips are showcased along this sidewalk.

#### Fair Haven Memorial Garden

604 E. 2nd St.

Originally planted in 1947 with the donation of tulip bulbs from Holland provided in gratitude for aid sent by the city of Pella after World War II, today these gardens feature over 13,000 tulips planted in 17 beds maintained by the Marion County Master Gardeners and other volunteers. The Garden also contains two monuments listing the local veterans who served in WWII. Located five blocks southeast of the downtown square at the corner of East Third and Union Streets, the public is invited to view these lovely tulips. Admission to the garden is free.

#### Pella Garden Club 58th Annual Flower Show

9 am – 6 pm | Scholte Church | Historical Village, 507 Franklin St. Featuring over 60 arrangements with tulips used in all fresh designs. Flowers grace antique furnishings of four vintage houses and a replica of Dominie Scholte's 19th century church. Tulip bulbs from Holland can be ordered at the flower show.

Enjoy the 147-bell carillon as you watch figures tell of Pella's early history or see a series of popular Tulip Time figures. The five bronze bells at the top were cast in Holland. Performance times are every 30 minutes during Tulip Time.

Pass" at either the North Gate or the Gift Shop. The Historical Village and Vermeer Windmill ticket includes a guided tour of the Vermeer Windmill (including the grinding and observation level) as well as the Wyatt Earp House, the Werkplaats, Van Spanckeren's General Store, Beason – Blommers Grist Mill, Dutch bakery, and more than 45,000 tulips planted throughout the Village! #### **Scholte House Museum**

The original home of Dominie H.P. Scholte, the founder of Pella. Scholte had promised his wife Maria he would build her a house like the elegant Dutch home they left behind in the Netherlands. He kept his promise and built this lovely mansion for her. The house features the personal belongings of the Scholte family. Located behind the house are the Scholte Formal Gardens featuring two lifesized bronze statues among almost 50,000 tulips.

#### **Tuttle Cabin** 608 Lincoln Street | 10 am - 2 pm | \$

The Thomas F. and Nancy Tuttle Log House is the oldest building in Pella. This "birthplace of Pella" is the cabin where Dominie Scholte purchased the land that became the heart of Pella. The cabin is a wood, 1.5 story 'singlepen' (one room dwelling), originally constructed in 1843 with walls made of square hewn, walnut logs about 6 x 6

The Pella Depot Museum is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and contains memorabilia of its early days as an important stop on the railroad system. It contains historical documents related to the growth of Rolscreen Company from its move to Pella in 1926 through today's Pella Corporation.

#### **Vermeer Corporation Museum**
